I'm enrolled in a C-I course, but what does that really mean?

We're glad you asked! At LSU, we are committed to helping you build your skillset in areas that employers and future collaborators in all fields and industries consider paramount for success: effective communication.\* In Communication-Intensive (C-I) courses, the instructor will help you advance your communication skills while you simultaneously learn the course content. It's essentially an opportunity to upgrade your experience without taking additional courses! There are more than 300 C-I courses offered each semester across the disciplines.

### What's the LSU Communicator Certificate all about?

The LSU Communicator Certificate is your opportunity to receive additional recognition for the work you are doing in your C-I courses. If you complete a C-I course with a B- or higher, you're automatically on track toward earning it! Once you complete the required number of C-I courses and submit a written reflection about them, you receive a certificate acknowledging your success!

### How do I get that LSU Distinguished Communicator Medal?

If you liked the sound of the LSU Communicator Certificate and you are interested in even more opportunities to build your communication skills, the LSU Distinguished Communicator Medal program is a great fit for you! In addition to earning the Certificate, DC Medal candidates receive customized communication skills mentorship from LSU faculty and staff while creating a public-facing ePortfolio that showcases their multimodal communication skills and their experiences in and beyond the classroom.

When you successfully complete the program, you earn a permanent designation on your official LSU transcript, a medal at graduation, and—most importantly—you are stepping into your future with the skills and confidence to show the world you have arrived and are ready for whatever you encounter.
