Scholarships for Study Abroad

- LSU Study Abroad Scholarship: Open to domestic and international students at the undergraduate and graduate levels. Students must be enrolled at LSU and degree-seeking in order to be considered for this award. Selected recipients will receive one-time scholarships of \$1,500.00 to be used towards LSU study abroad programs. Please email studyabroad@lsu.edu for more information.
- Annette Kade Scholarship: Open to students who are participating in an ISEP
 exchange and who will be studying in French or German at an ISEP member institution
 in Austria, France, the French Antilles, Germany, Reunion Island, or Switzerland.
 Students must have a demonstrated financial need.
- Benjamin A. Gilman Scholarship Programs: A grant program that enables students
 with financial need to study or intern abroad, thereby gaining skills critical to U.S.
 national security and economic competitiveness. Open to U.S. citizens who are
 undergraduate students and who receive Federal Pell Grant funding.
 - The Gilman McCain Scholarship provides awards of \$5,000 to child dependents of active duty service members to study or intern abroad on credit-bearing programs. To qualify, you must be an undergraduate student and a U.S. citizen, receive some form of Title IV federal financial aid, and participate in a program that is at least 21 days long.
 - The Gilman Critical Need Language Award: Students who are already applying for a Gilman scholarship and who plan to study a language that is classified as "critical need" can apply for an additional award of \$3,000. (Note: You must also apply for and meet the requirements for the Gilman scholarship). See the scholarship link for a list of critical languages.
 - The Gilman DAAD Scholarship provides scholarships for exceptional U.S. undergraduate students to study and/or intern for academic credit in Germany through the Gilman Program.
- Boren Awards: Provides funding for U.S. undergraduate students to study less commonly taught languages in world regions critical to U.S. interests and underrepresented in study abroad, including Africa, Asia, Central and Eastern Europe, Latin America, and the Middle East.
- Corinne Jeannine Schillings Foundation Scholarships: These scholarships support undergraduate Silver or Gold Award Girl Scouts who plan to study abroad. \$1,000 is provided directly to the winners upon verification that they have begun their study abroad programs. Those awarded must maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.0.
- **Diversity Abroad Overseas Ambassador Scholarship:** Offers \$500 scholarships for fall and spring semesters as well as summer term. Five scholarships are available for the fall semester, five for spring, and two for summer. Students going abroad for the full fall, spring, or summer terms are eligible to apply. Economically disadvantaged students,

- first-generation students, students with disabilities, and ethnically and racially diverse students are strongly encouraged to apply.
- Freeman Asia: Funding for undergraduates who receive need-based financial aid and have been accepted into a study abroad program in East or Southeast Asia.
- Fund for Education Abroad (FEA) Scholarships: FEA seeks to provide scholarships and ongoing support to students who are underrepresented among current U.S. study abroad populations. Funding is available for U.S. citizens with financial need who wish to study abroad. Students who represent a group that is traditionally underrepresented in study abroad are especially encouraged to apply. Individuals who complete the application by the deadline will automatically be considered for all scholarships funded by FEA for which they are eligible. Scholarships include:
 - Access Partner Scholarships awarded to minority and first-generation students
 - Hiliary Echo Douglas Memorial Scholarship for students who plan to study in Vietnam or within other Southeast Asian cultures
 - Jane Gluckmann & Carol Rausch Go Abroad Scholarship for students who plan to study abroad in Mexico, Central America, South America, France, or Germany
 - Rainbow Scholarships awarded to LGBTQIA students
 - Eleni Zachariou Memorial Scholarship for Study in Greece awarded to students studying abroad in Greece
 - NAFSA Tamara H. Bryant Memorial Scholarship awarded to African-American undergraduate students
 - SITA Scholarship preference is given to those who wish to study abroad in southern India; however, all are encouraged to apply
 - A. Rewari Family Scholarship for Study Abroad in Denmark awarded to students studying abroad in Denmark
 - Cyril Taylor Memorial Scholarship for Study in the UK awarded to students studying abroad in the UK
 - Gateway International Group Education Abroad Scholarship preference given to first-generation students or those whose home is in Kentucky
- Inclusive Ireland Scholarship: Created to provide academically rigorous and culturally immersive study abroad experiences for students from all backgrounds and identities, the Inclusive Ireland scholarship awards 3,000 Euro to undergraduate students who identify as BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, and People of Color), who intend to study abroad at one of the participating universities in Ireland, and who have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above. - ISEP Scholarships: For students participating in ISEP programs.
 - The Accessibility Scholarship is designed to assist students placed in an ISEP program who do not have sufficient funds to cover the upfront costs of studying abroad.
 - The Africa for All Scholarship encourages student participation in a broad array of programs across the African continent. The ISEP Africa for All Scholarship is intended to make these programs more inclusive and accessible

- to heritage-seeking students, who are defined as those who choose their study abroad location based on having cultural heritage in Africa.
- The Community Scholarship is open to students who are participating in an ISEP exchange and who have demonstrated financial need. Students from historically underrepresented groups in study abroad (including first-generation college students, students who are LGBTQ, students with a disability, students who belong to ethnic, racial, or religious minorities, and students who are studying in a foreign language) are especially encouraged to apply.
- The Founders Fellowship is open to students who are participating in an ISEP exchange and who have demonstrated financial need. Students from historically underrepresented groups in study abroad (including first-generation college students, students who are LGBTQ, students with a disability, students who belong to ethnic, racial, or religious minorities, and students who are studying in a foreign language) are especially encouraged to apply.
- The Kansai Gaidai University Merit Scholarship is open to students who are participating in an ISEP Direct program at Kansai Gaidai University in Japan and who have maintained a 3.0 cumulative GPA for the two semesters preceding their exchange.
- Phi Kappa Phi Study Abroad Grant: Designed to help support undergraduates as they
 seek knowledge and experience in their academic fields by studying abroad, these
 grants are open to students whose home universities have Phi Kappa Phi chapters (LSU
 does!), who have a cumulative GPA of 3.75 or higher, and whose study abroad
 programs start between May 1 and June 30.

- Critical Language Scholarships Program: A fully funded summer study abroad opportunity for American students (undergraduate and graduate) to learn the following languages: Arabic, Azerbaijani, Bangla, Chinese, Hindi, Indonesian, Japanese, Korean, Persian, Portuguese, Punjabi, Russian, Swahili, Turkish, and Urdu.
- Charles B. Rangel International Affairs Graduate Fellowships: U.S. State
 Department program administered by Howard University that seeks to attract and
 prepare outstanding young people for careers as diplomats in the Foreign Service of the
 U.S. Department of State. Applicants should be seniors or recent college graduates who
 want to join the Foreign Service. Members of minority groups historically
 underrepresented in the Foreign Service, women, and those with financial need are
 especially encouraged to apply.
- Congress-Bundestag Youth Exchange for Young Professionals: Fellowship funded by the German Bundestag and the U.S. Department of State that annually provides 75 American and 75 German young professionals, between the ages of 18 and 24, the opportunity to spend one year in each others' countries studying, interning, and living

with hosts on a cultural immersion program. Please email **studyabroad@lsu.edu** for more information about this program.

- DAAD Grants and Scholarships
 - Research Grants: Funding for PhD and post-doctorate short-term research (1-6 months) at a German university
 - Scholarships for Studying German: For undergraduate and/or graduate students who want to learn German at a German university; to be eligible, coursework must be done in German
 - Study Abroad Scholarships Master's Program: Final year undergraduate students or those who have received an undergraduate degree in any discipline may apply for the DAAD Study Scholarship for a full Master's degree program at a German university or for study at a German university as part of a postgraduate or Master's degree program completed in the home country.
- Fulbright Scholar Programs: Fellowships for graduating college seniors, graduate students, young professionals, and artists to study, conduct research, or teach their native language.
- Thomas R. Pickering Foreign Affairs Fellowship: Funded by the U.S. Department of State and administered by The Washington Center for Internships and Academic Seminars, this program provides graduate students with financial support, mentoring, and professional development to prepare them academically and professionally for a career with the U.S. Department of State. Women, members of minority groups historically underrepresented in the Foreign Service, and students with financial need are encouraged to apply.
- Samuel Huntington Public Service Award: Provides a \$15,000 stipend for a
 graduating college senior to pursue one year of public service anywhere in the world
 (may be used domestically or internationally).

Funding Domestic Exchange through NSE

The National Student Exchange (NSE) program provides two payment options for tuition and fees, often reducing the costs of exchange.

If you are considering a Canadian domestic exchange, you can also apply for the <u>Killam Fellowship</u>. Killam Fellows spend a semester or a full year as an exchange student in Canada. The program offers . . .

- A cash award of \$5,000 for a semester
- A competitive health benefits package
- The opportunity to participate in Canadian academic and cultural programs outside of your host city
