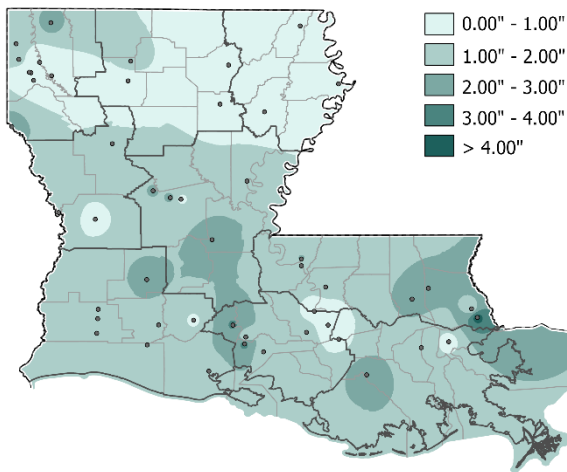

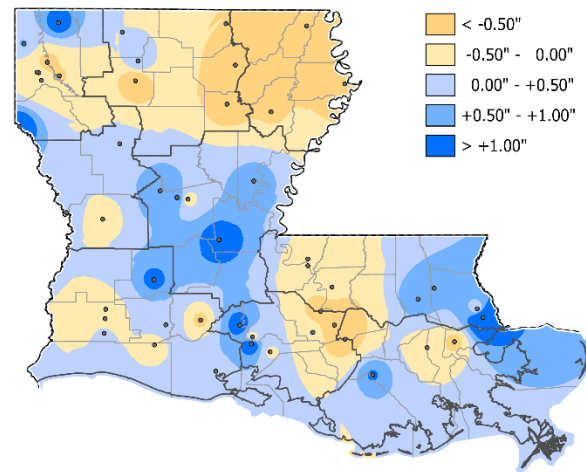
7-Day Accumulated Rainfall & Average Temperatures: 03 - 09 June 2026

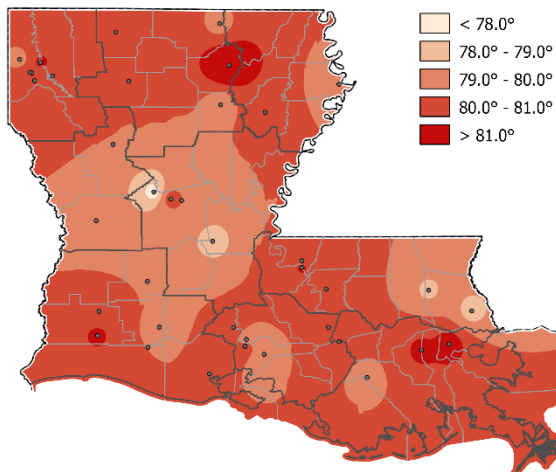
7-Day Departure from Normal Precipitation (Inches)

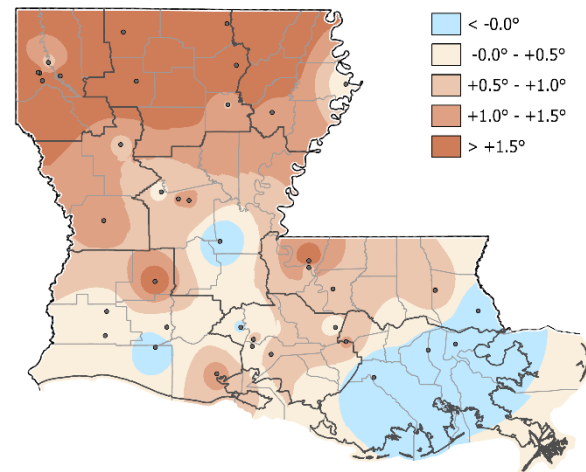
- a summer-like pattern across the Bayou State with daily showers and t-storms occurring during the “heat of the day”; coverage was generally less than in recent periods
- as is common for summer, localized heavy rains produced flooding, particularly on June 6th, prompting the Lake Charles and Slidell NWS offices to issue a few *Flash Flood Warnings* (p. 4)
- lowest 7-day rain totals were across sections of northern and southeastern Louisiana

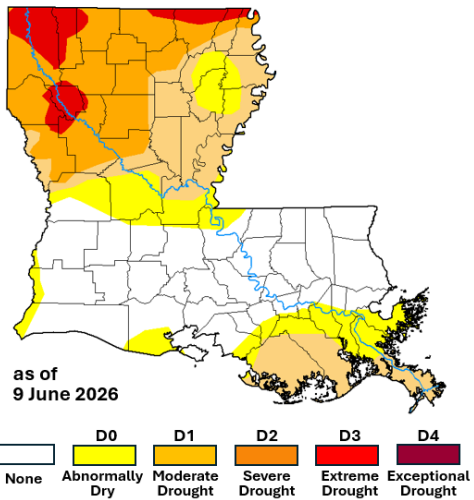
7-Day Departure from Normal Temperature (°F)

- average temperatures were generally above 7-day normals across the central and northern portions of Louisiana and below-normal across southeastern Louisiana where the timing and coverage of afternoon showers and t-storms kept daily maximum temperatures lower
- daily low temperatures averaged on the “warm” side statewide for the 7-day period; however, slightly drier air behind a front that stalled off the coast on June 3rd allowed temperatures on the morning of June 5th to drop into the 60°s for much of Louisiana

U.S. Weekly Drought Monitor

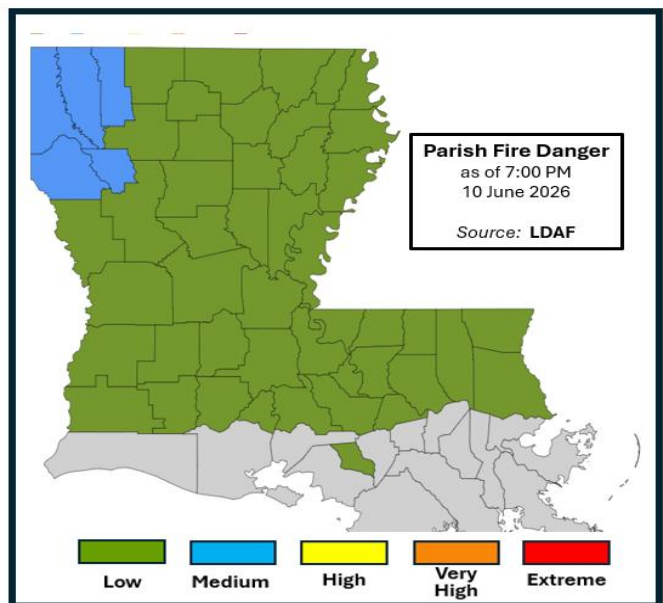
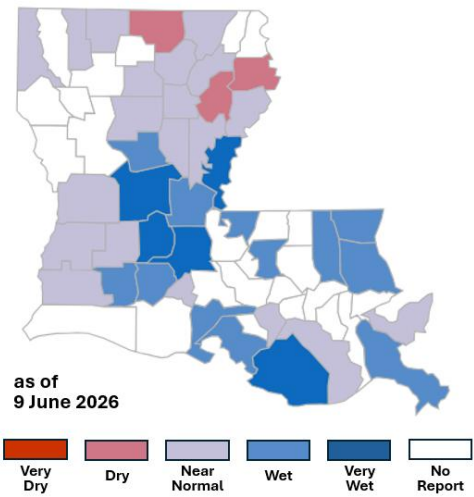


U.S. Drought Monitor (USDM): Issued June 11, 2026

- includes data thru June 9

- it was a drier 7-day period than recent prior ones across the Bayou State, yet amounts received were enough to continue to improve drought conditions for many parishes
- soil moisture levels are 'normal' to 'saturated' across central and southern Louisiana; unfortunately, soil moisture deficits remain across northern Louisiana closer to the Arkansas border
- vegetation has also responded positively to recent rains across central and southern Louisiana, less so across northern Louisiana; streamflows are 'near' to 'above-normal' across most of the state
- the updated **Drought Monitor** showed improvements across the entire state, reducing drought severity across much of south-eastern, central, and northern Louisiana
- after the improvements, the **USDM** shows 'Extreme Drought' (D3) coverage down to just over 5% of the state, the lowest since mid-February; total drought coverage (D1-D3) is now just over 45%, the lowest since late-December; and nearly 40% of the state is neither 'in drought' nor 'Abnormally Dry,' the most since early-October
- of the reports received as of June 09, most LSU AgCenter agents noted 'Near Normal', 'Wet', or 'Very Wet' conditions across their parishes; only three parishes -- Union, Madison and Franklin -- were deemed as still 'Dry', and most agents noted that there was 'No Substantial Change' or 'Slightly Improved' conditions
- as of June 10, no parishes had Burn Bans and parish Fire Danger Levels were listed as "Medium" or "Low" for all monitored parishes

LSU AgCenter Field Conditions



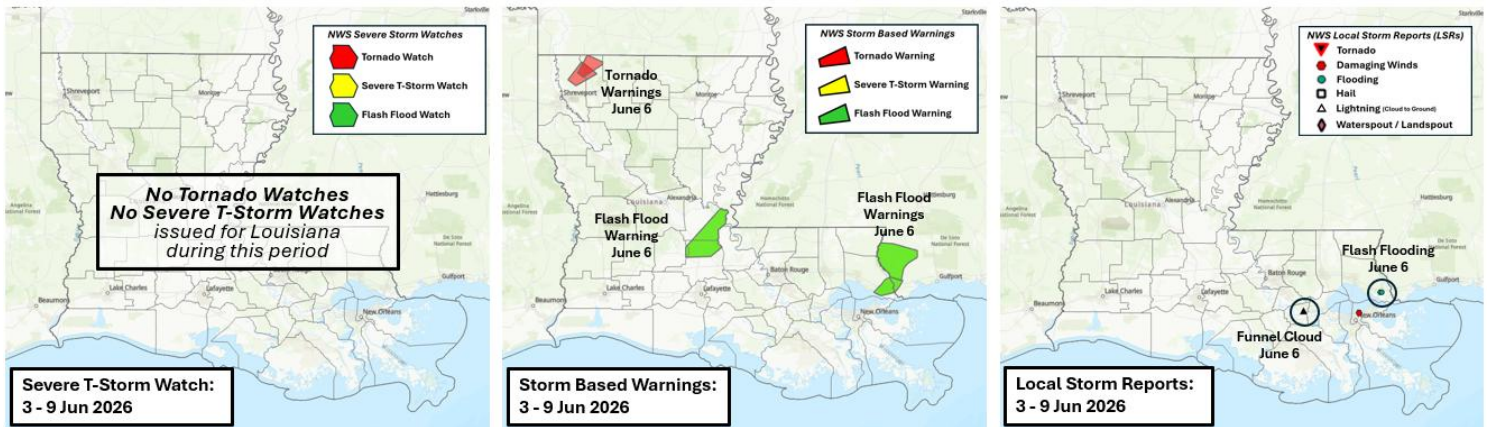
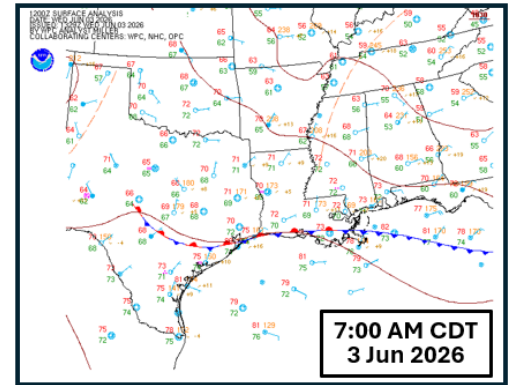
Parish **Burn Bans** are issued and lifted by local designated agencies and/or officials. **Daily Fire Danger** maps are produced by the USDA Forest Service, the Nat'l Interagency Fire Center (NIFC) & the LDAF.

Severe/Stormy Weather:

The 7-day run was relatively “quiet” in terms of active/severe weather, with only a handful of strong t-storms reported within the state.

No severe weather *Watches* were posted for the state during the 7-day stretch; there were only a handful of *Warnings* issued, all on June 6th.

A lone front moved through Louisiana on June 2-3, reaching the Gulf on the morning of the 3rd and dissipating there. That front generated no active weather but did provide a brief respite from Gulf humidity, if only for a few days.
