A Wet, Sometimes Stormy 7-Day Run

Spring is climatologically the stormiest season of the year for the Bayou State, but the drought that has plagued much of Louisiana during 2026 has kept severe weather in check for much of the state over the past several weeks. That changed during this 7-day stretch.

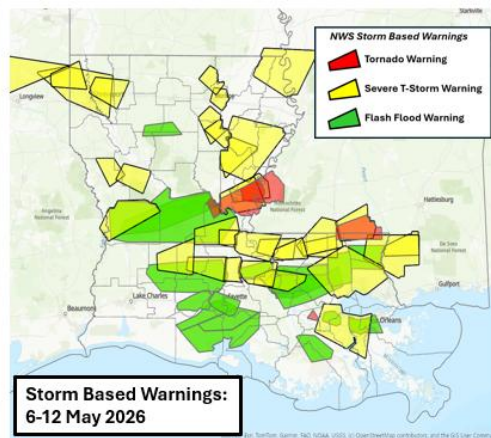
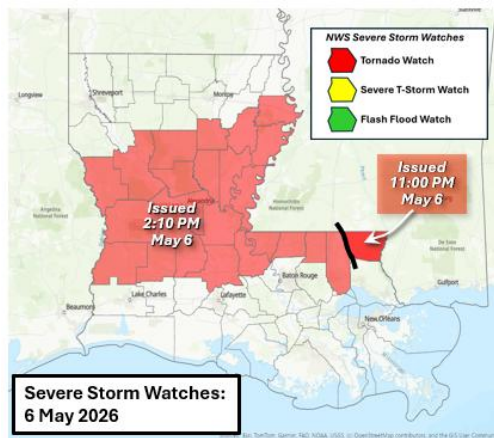
The period opened with a *Tornado Watch* issued for the central parishes on the afternoon of May 6. Fortunately, Louisiana was spared from the tornado outbreak that struck SW Mississippi just north of the LA/MS state line that evening. But over the course of the 7 days, NWS offices issued nearly 60 *Warnings* across Louisiana, including 6 *Tornado Warnings*, 33 *Severe T-Storm Warnings*, and 19 *Flash Flood Warnings*.

5 of those *Tornado Warnings* were issued on May 6th (in conjunction with the same storms that generated the SW Mississippi outbreak) with a lone *Tornado Warning* and confirmed touchdown (likely an EF-0) in St. James Parish on the evening of May 11th.

Even in the midst of a statewide drought, Louisiana can experience brief flooding periods as a response to locally-heavy downpours. A pair of fronts (p. 5) were largely responsible for substantial rain totals across much of the state, with more than two dozen south Louisiana stations reporting more than 6.00" of rain for the period: essentially a month's worth of rain in a week's time.

The Baton Rouge area was hardest hit as 4 BR metro area locations recorded in excess of 10" of rain for the period: most of that falling on May 8-9.

However, not all of Louisiana was lucky enough to get a reprieve from the recent dry weather pattern. Nearly half of the reporting sites in the three northern climate divisions recorded less than 1.00" of rain for the period, with Logansport (NW Div) being the statewide 'dry spot' with just 0.24" of rain for the 7-day total.



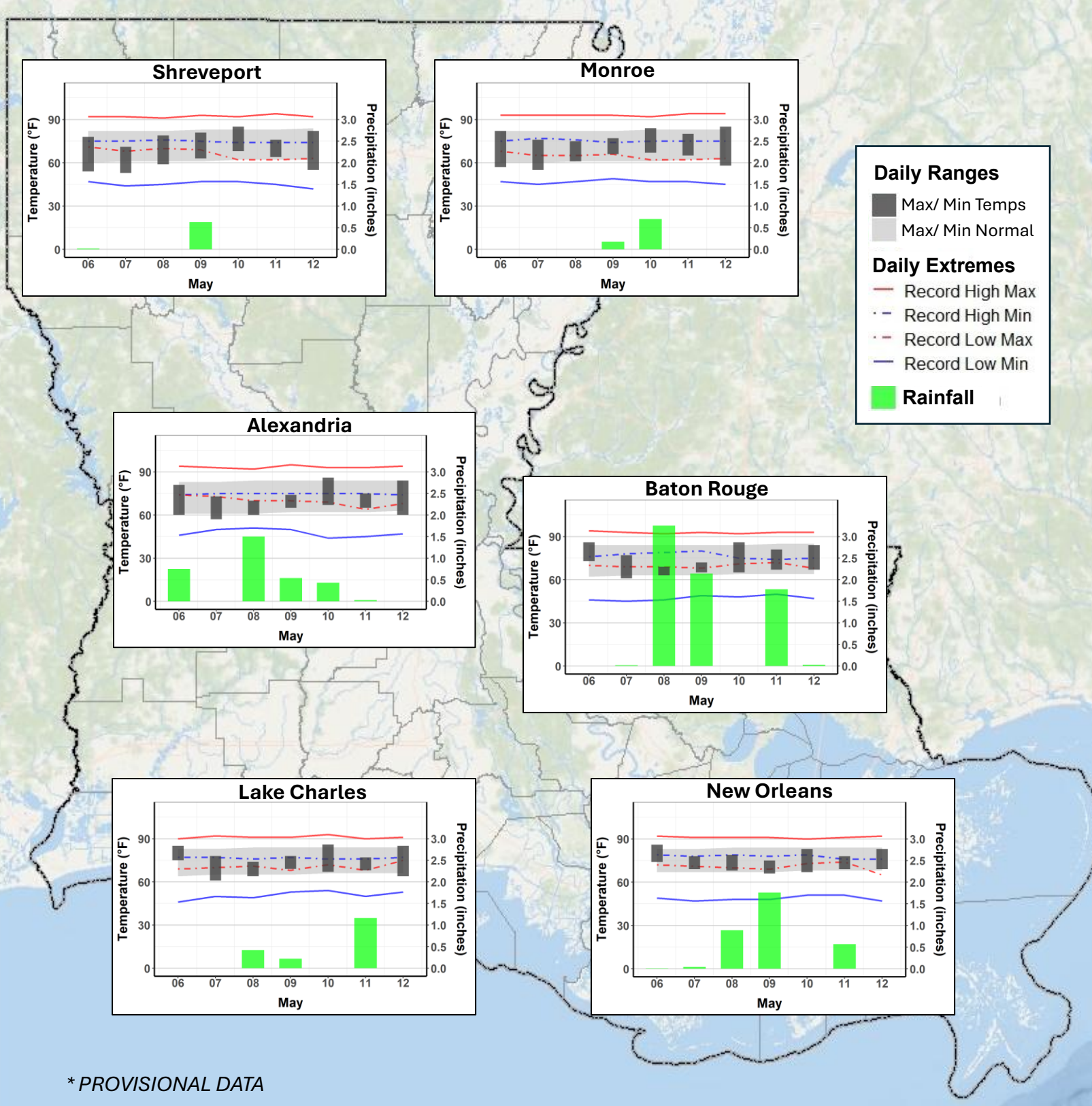
Local Storm Reports (LSRs) for the 7-day period also reflect the impacts of the weather activity on May 8 and 9, with a majority of Louisiana LSRs for the 7-day stretch being posted on those two dates.

Locally-damaging winds and large hail were the primary culprits, but flash flooding was also a problem across the southern half of the state on those dates as well.

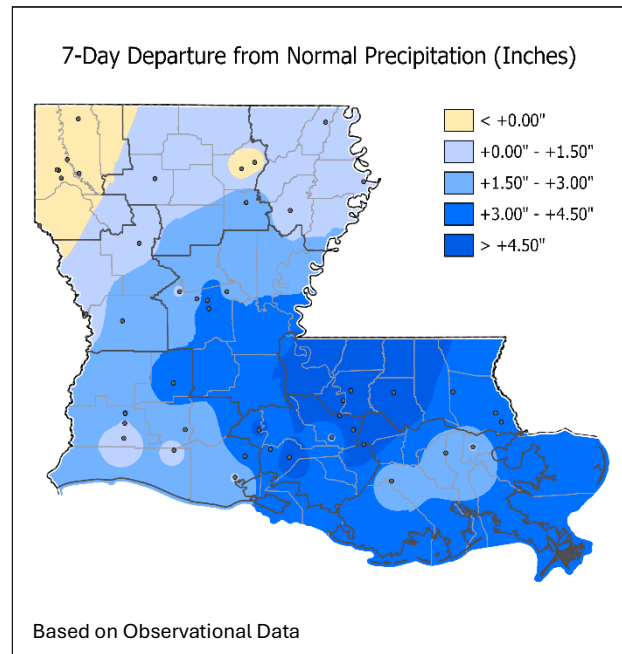
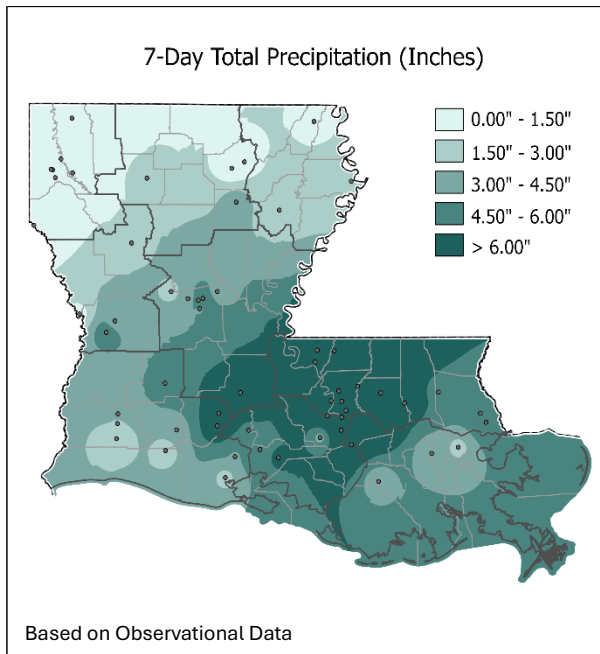
The heavy rains of May 8-9 led to the issuance of a number of *River Flood Warnings* for several south Louisiana rivers and bayous on May 9 and 10, especially in the eastern Florida Parishes, with a few of those *Warnings* remaining in effect into mid-May.



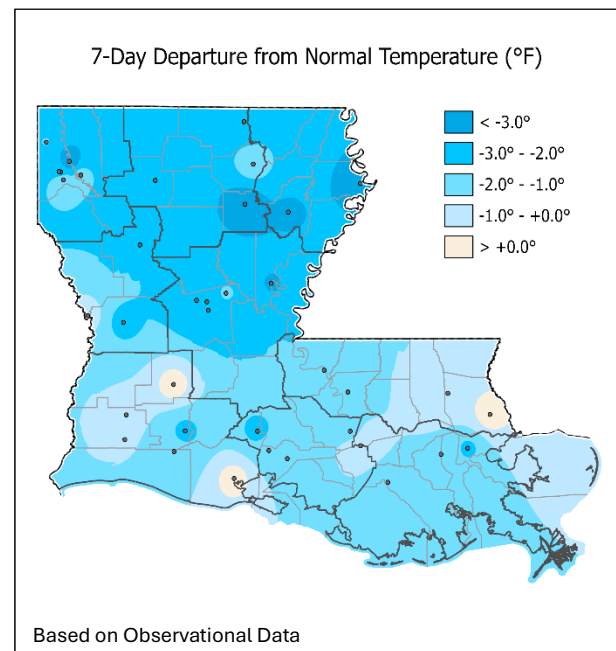
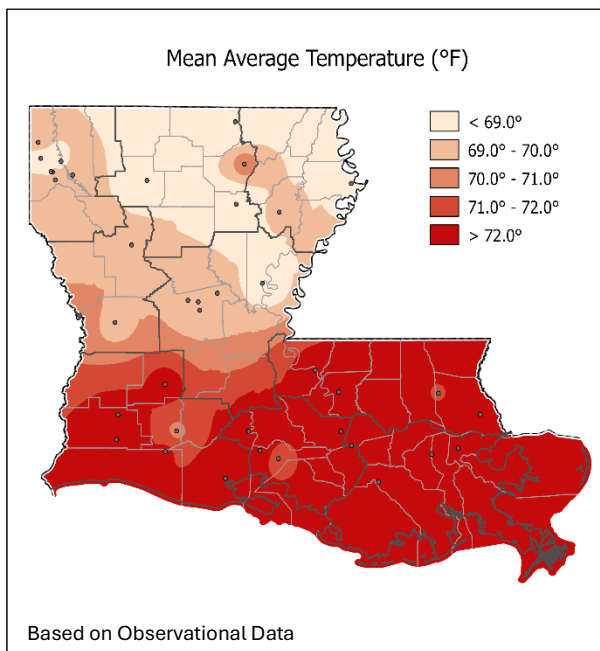
7-Day Climographs: 06 - 12 May 2026



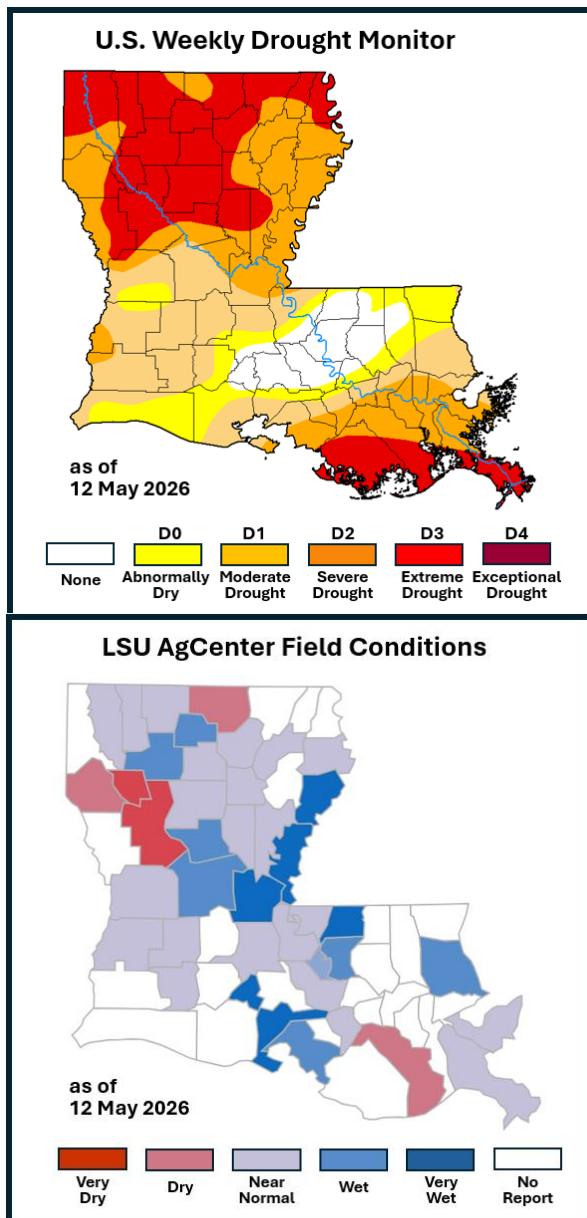
7-Day Accumulated Rainfall & Average Temperatures: 06 - 12 May 2026



- it was an active 7-day period throughout Louisiana as a pair of fronts contributed to several rounds of precipitation and locally-severe weather
- the highest rain totals were across central and southeastern Louisiana where there were numerous reports of flash flooding in urban areas; the Baton Rouge area received over 11.00" during the 7-day run (p. 7-8)
- rains made a significant positive impact on drought conditions in central and southern Louisiana; however, northern Louisiana received lesser amounts and drought conditions persisted



- for the second consecutive 7-day period, average temperatures were below normal across most of Louisiana
- persistent cloud cover associated with daily rounds of showers and thunderstorms kept high temperatures below-normal for many locations; in contrast, minimum temperatures were generally near-normal

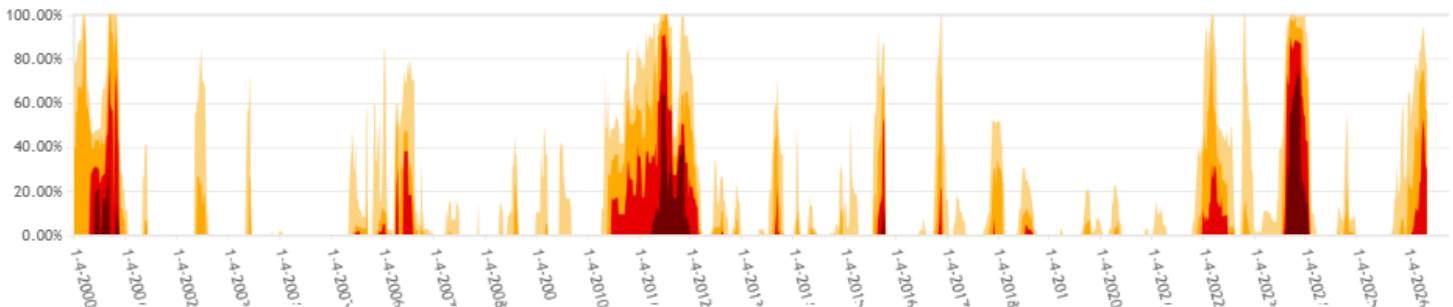


U.S. Drought Monitor (USDM): Issued May 14, 2026

- includes data thru May 12

- Louisiana was inundated by several rounds of showers and thunderstorms during the 7-day period; central and southern Louisiana were hit particularly hard with many locations receiving more than 5.00" of rain and some reporting more than 11.00"
- in response, the updated **Drought Monitor** showed large areas of improvements in central and southern Louisiana but only limited to minimal improvements across most northern parishes
- overall drought coverage was reduced to less than 80% of the state; 'Extreme Drought' (D3) decreasing from 44% of the state for the previous period to 29% as of May 12th
- 'Severe Drought' (D2) and 'Moderate Drought' (D1) each extend over roughly 1/4th of the state
- for the first time in more than a month there are areas of Louisiana rated as 'near normal' (for this time of year)
- of reports received on May 12, LSU AgCenter agents noted "Very Dry" or "Dry" conditions across 5 parishes with 14 parishes tagged as "Wet" or "Very Wet"; 26 parishes were deemed as "Slightly" or "Significantly" improved with regard to soil-moisture status by the end of the 7-day stretch
- as of May 12, no parishes had Burn Bans in effect and Fire Danger Levels were posted as "High" for only 3 parishes with "Medium" or "Low" fire danger for the remaining parishes that are monitored (not shown)

Statewide Perspective of USDM Drought since 2000

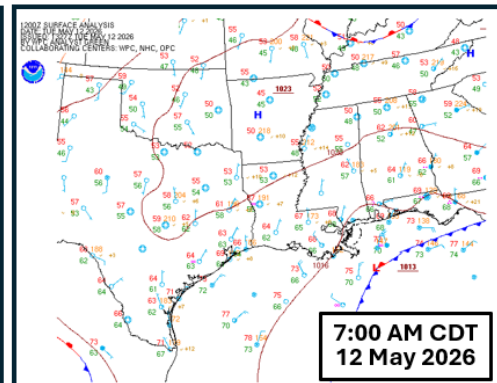
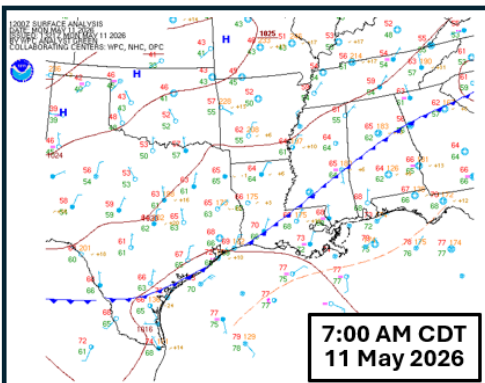
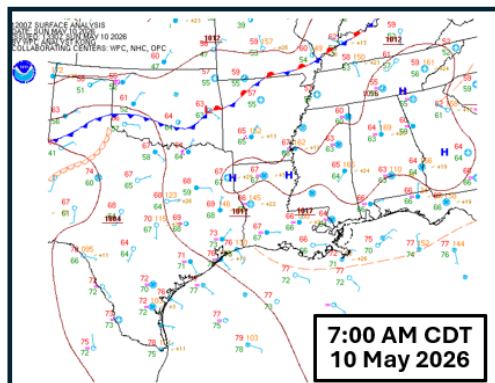
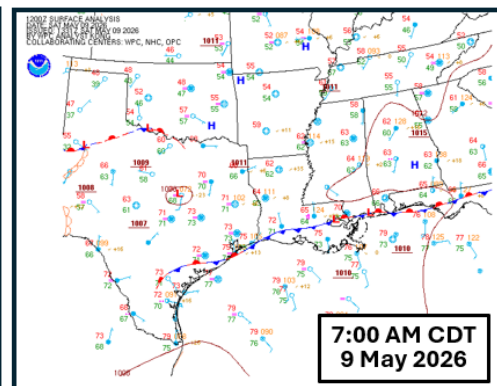
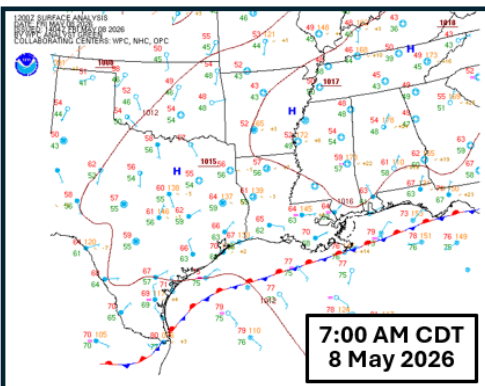
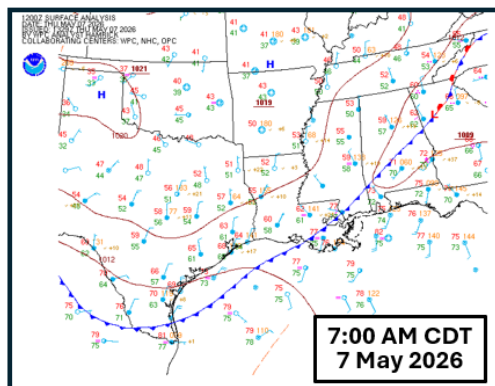
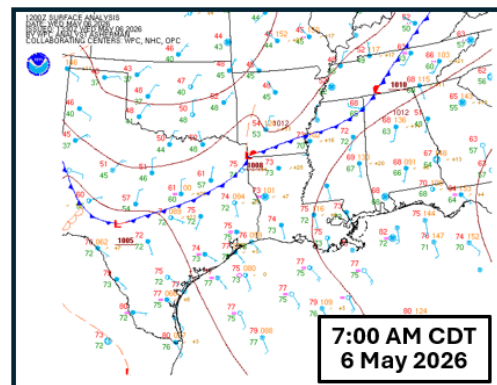
This timeline provides a visual perspective of the current drought impacting Louisiana (far right) compared to other drought periods extending through Louisiana's **USDM** record dating back to 2000. While the current drought is noteworthy, it is far from the most intense nor longest-lasting event (thus far) of the past two-and-a-half decades.

A Pair of Rainmakers:

The rainy pattern for the 7-day stretch was largely the product of two fronts that rolled through the lower Mississippi Valley.

The first front arrived on the morning of May 6th, slowly advanced to the coastal waters by May 8th, then stalled and meandered along and near the coast through the 10th before dissipating.

The second front was a bit more progressive, arriving over Louisiana on May 10th and moving into the coastal waters by the 12th.

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Precipitation and temperature data are primarily retrieved through the ACIS QueryBuilder (rcc-acis.org) and the cli-MATE platform (MRCC Application Tools Environment), both of which are maintained by the NOAA Regional Climate Centers (RCCs).

Drought data are sourced from the U.S. Drought Monitor (unl.edu), the LSU AgCenter, and the Louisiana Dept. of Agriculture & Forestry.
