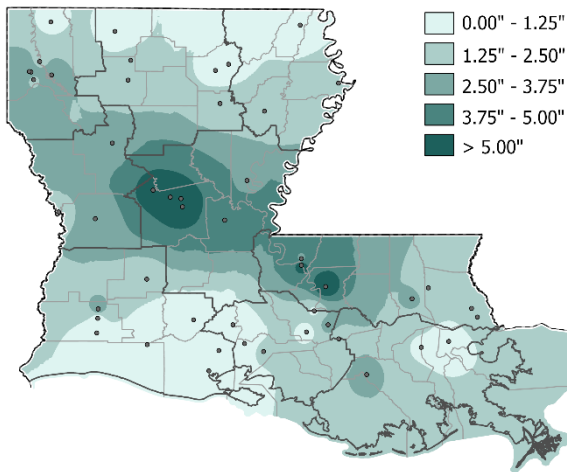

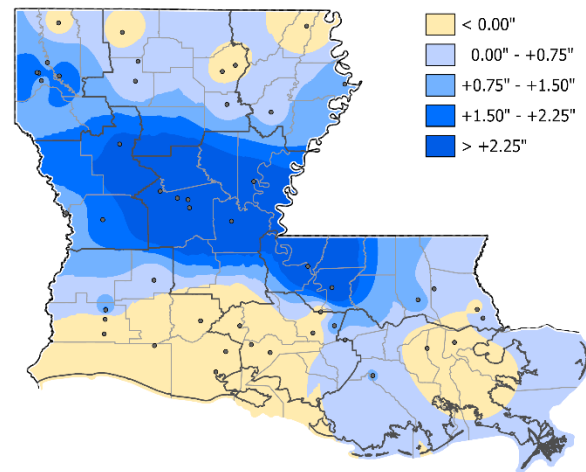
7-Day Accumulated Rainfall & Average Temperatures: 10 - 16 June 2026

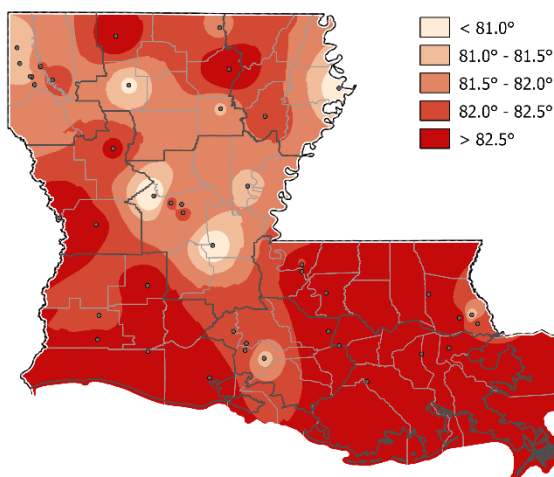
7-Day Departure from Normal Precipitation (Inches)

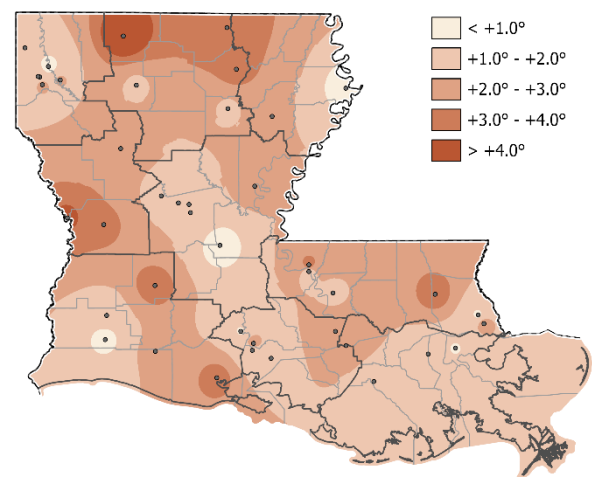
- the 7-day period started off mostly dry with only a few “pop-up” storms each day as the Bayou State was under the influence of surface high pressure centered to the east
- a frontal boundary moved into and then stalled and meandered over the northern half of the state between June 15-16; the front interacted with tropical moisture associated with a low in the northwestern Gulf to increase precipitation coverage/totals, particularly across portions of central and southeastern Louisiana, prompting several *Flash Flood Warnings* (p. 4)
- totals were above 7-day norms across most of the state, particularly central Louisiana, but below norms over sections of northern, southwestern, and southeastern Louisiana

Mean Average Temperature (°F)



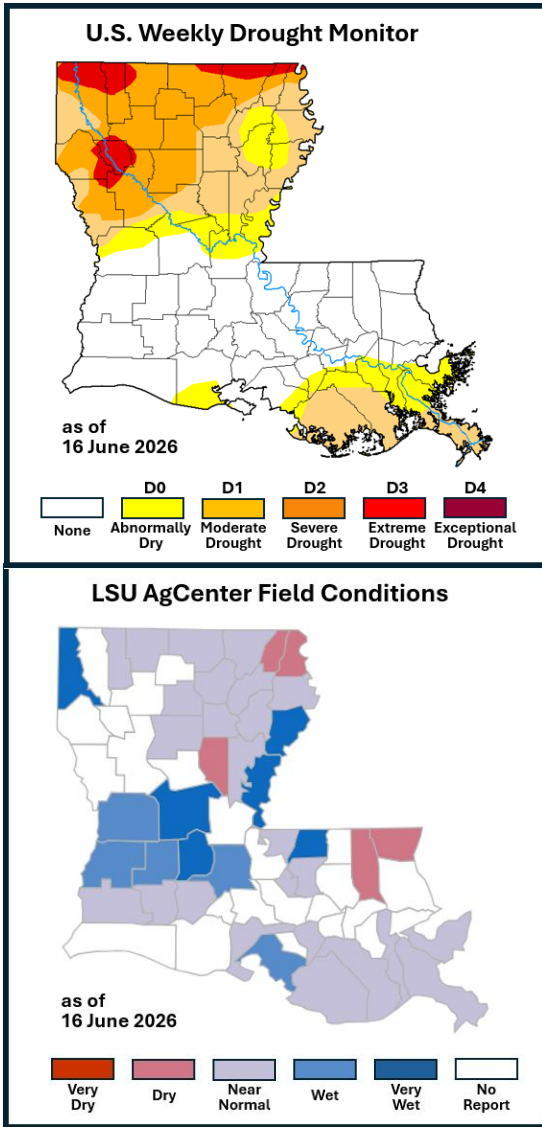

- the 7-day period began with the highest afternoon temperatures of the season thus far as surface ridging limited precipitation and cloud coverage, allowing temperatures to soar into the mid- and upper-90°s with peak heat indices climbing above 100°F
- very humid conditions kept 7-day average daily minimum temperatures in the mid-70°s
- overall, average temperatures during the 7-day run were above-normal statewide

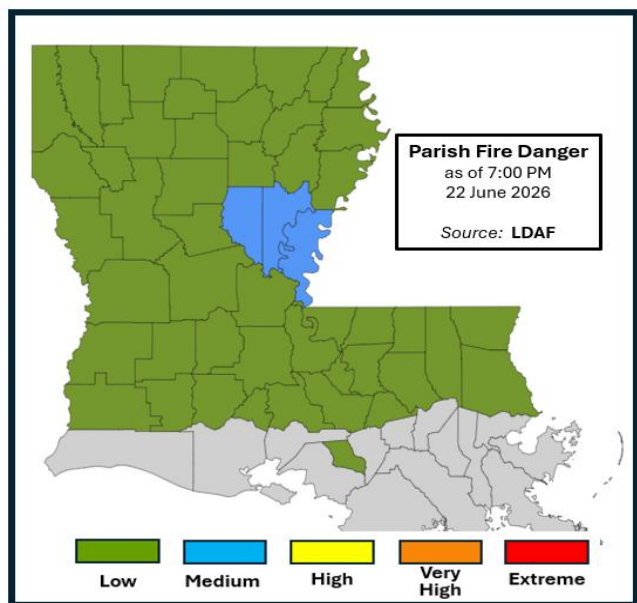
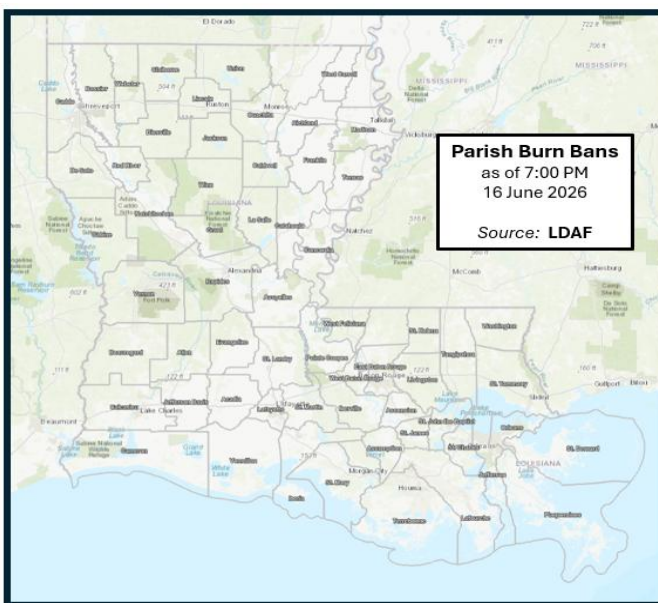


U.S. Drought Monitor (USDM): Issued June 18, 2026

- includes data thru June 16

- the 7-day monitoring period started off mostly dry with only isolated daily t-storms; however, a number of parishes, especially across central Louisiana, recorded 3" to 5" of rain (or more) between June 15-16 thanks to abundant Gulf moisture moving into the state
- in response, the updated **Drought Monitor** showed improvements across central Louisiana and also in the Shreveport area where heavy rains caused flash flooding
- after the improvements, the **USDM** shows 'Extreme Drought' (D3) coverage down to less than 5% of the state and total drought coverage (D1-D3) down to just over 40%; almost half of the state is now rated as "near normal to wet"
- of the reports received as of June 16, only five parish agents noted 'Dry' conditions while 35 noted conditions as being 'Near Normal', 'Wet', or 'Very Wet'; 12 agents noted that conditions had 'Slightly' or 'Significantly' improved across their parishes with another 12 noting 'Slightly' or 'Significantly' degraded conditions with all others noting 'No Substantial Change'
- as of June 16, no parishes had Burn Bans and parish Fire Danger Levels were listed as "Medium" or "Low" for all monitored parishes (June 22 displayed here)

Looking Ahead: The Climate Prediction Center released their *Seasonal Drought Outlook* (June 18-Sept 30) and noted that drought could persist across north-central and northwestern Louisiana but should improve or be removed altogether in northeastern Louisiana.



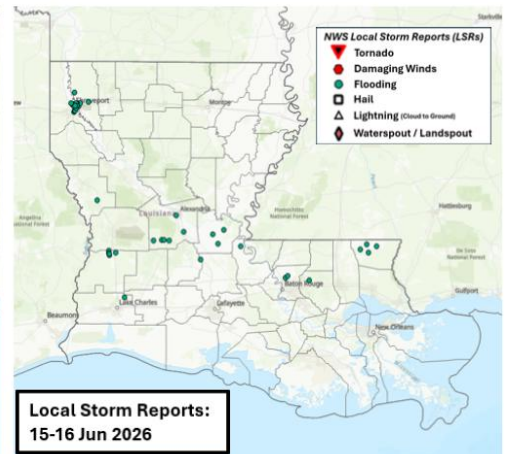
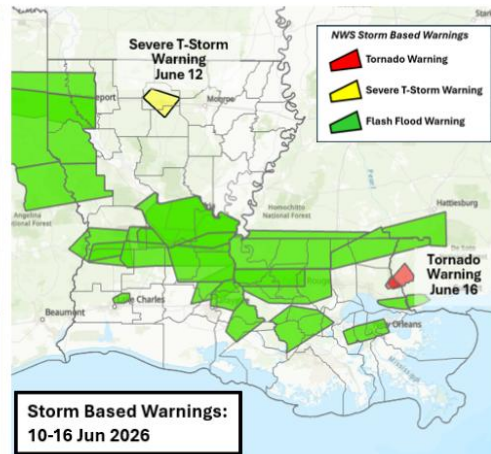
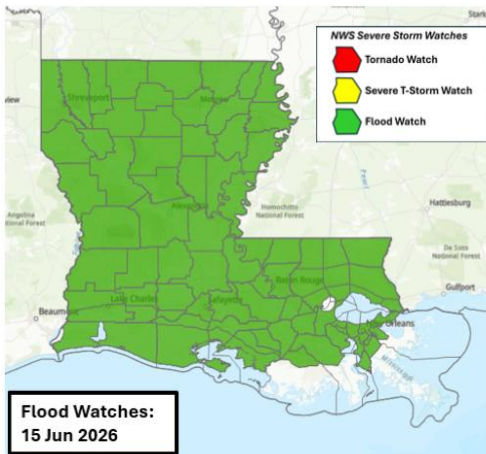
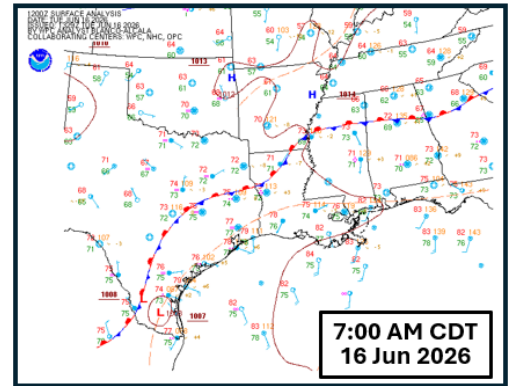
Parish **Burn Bans** are issued and lifted by local designated agencies and/or officials. **Daily Fire Danger** maps are produced by the USDA Forest Service, the Nat'l Interagency Fire Center (NIFC) & the LDAF.

Severe/Stormy Weather:

A 'cool' front slipped into northern Louisiana, stalled and meandered there from June 15 to 16 before lifting to the north.

A lone *Severe T-Storm Warning* was issued over northern Louisiana on the evening of the 12th (no damage reported); a *Tornado Warning* was issued on the morning of the 16th for eastern St. Tammany Parish (no confirmed touchdown). The remainder of the storm-based warnings were *Flash Flood Warnings* issued for numerous parishes on June 15 and 16.

Local storm reports for the 7-day stretch were composed entirely of flash flooding reports on the 15th and 16th.
