T.S. Arthur

The center of T.S. Arthur did not get particularly close to Louisiana, becoming post-tropical while crossing Galveston Bay on the evening of 17 June 2026. Yet Arthur left an indelible mark on the Bayou State, with displaced energy to the east of the storm center generating at least 14 tornadoes in southeast Louisiana.

Additionally, Arthur's remnants were responsible for a record-breaking 24-hour rain total of 29.06" in Avoyelles Parish on June 18th at a CoCoRaHS site located southeast of Cottonport. Multiple locations in the area reported 1-day totals topping 20.00", adding to the confidence in the record-setting Cottonport 3.4 SE total.

Originally forming from the merger of a tropical wave and the remnants of the East Pacific's T.S. Cristina, the disturbance made its way into Mexico and then tracked north-northeast into Texas. The NHC began issuing *Advisories* for Potential Tropical Cyclone #1 (PTC-1) at 10:00 AM CDT on June 16th, coupled with a *Tropical Storm Watch* that extended from the central Texas coast to Morgan City. That *Watch* was upgraded to a *Tropical Storm Warning* along the Louisiana coast just 6 hours later.

Strong westerly wind shear limited the opportunity for PTC-1 to become well-organized, but the NHC still confirmed the upgrade to T.S. Arthur at 10:00 AM CDT on the 17th, noting sustained winds of 40 mph. Peak sustained winds would top-out at 45 mph over the next 6 hours as Arthur moved erratically offshore and then inland along the coast, with the NHC noting a center re-location from near Matagorda/Bay City to Texas City/Galveston. Sustained winds dropped back to 40 mph for the 7:00 PM *Advisory* that evening, and by 10:00 PM, the NHC declared Arthur as 'post-tropical.'

NWS/New Orleans has confirmed 14 tornadoes (p. 2 & 5) across southeast Louisiana on June 18th linked to the broad 'footprint' of Arthur's remnants. All 14 were rated as EF-0s or EF-1s and all but one

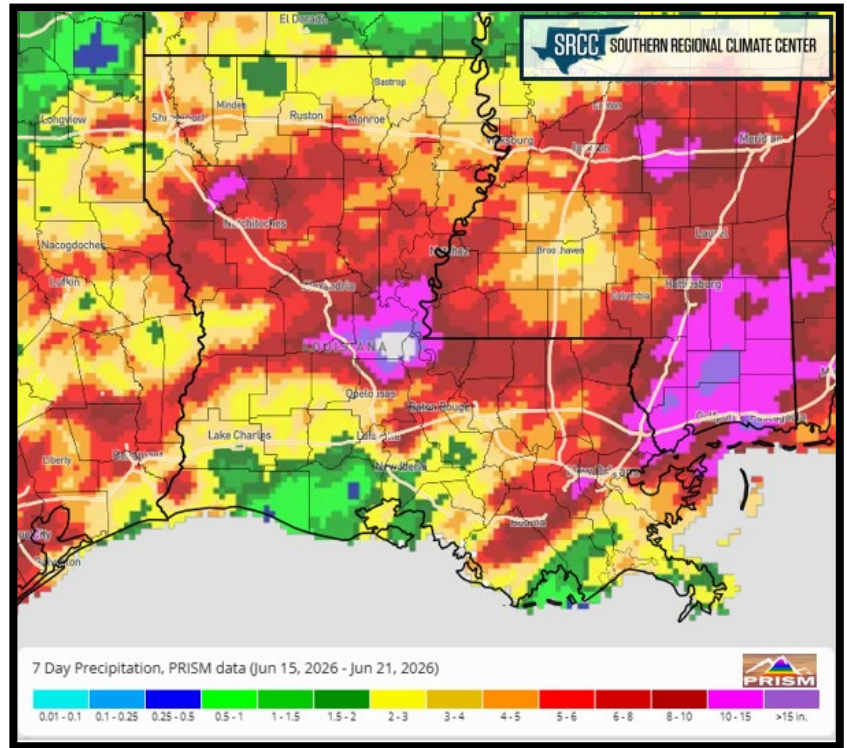

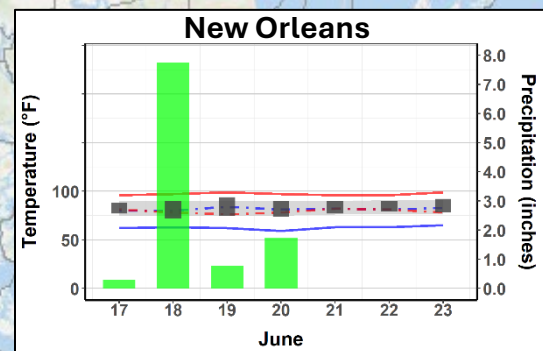
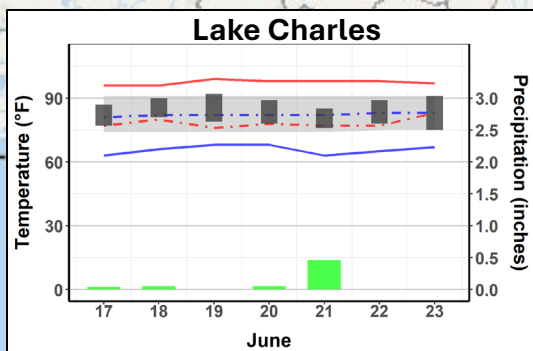
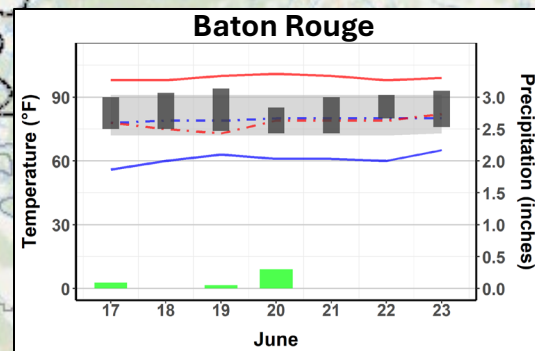
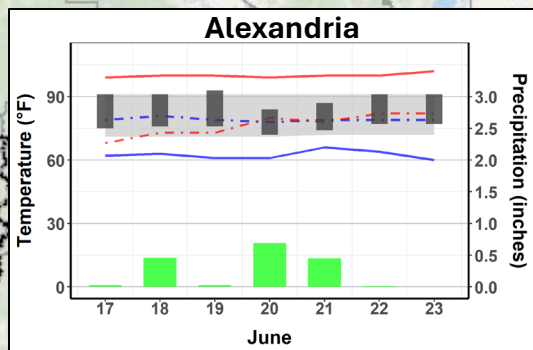
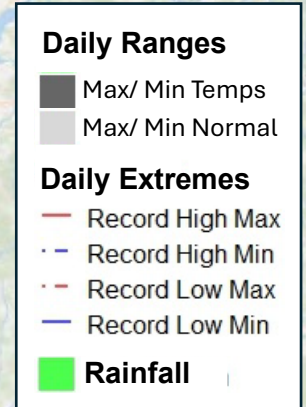
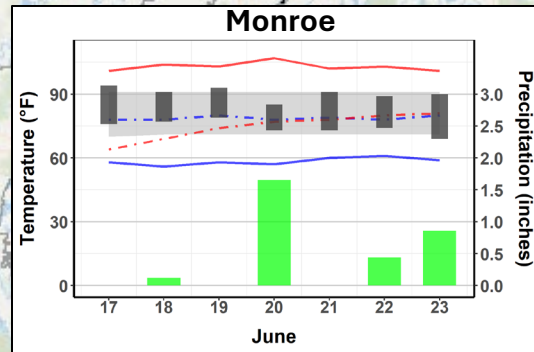
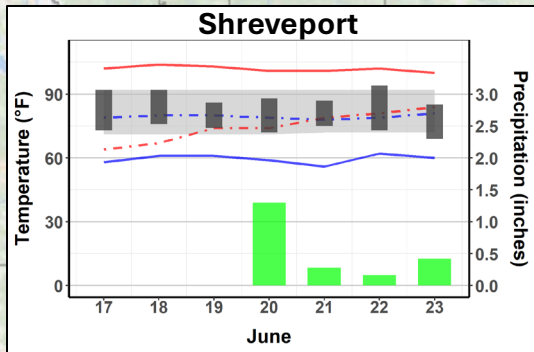
occurred between 1:00 - 7:15 AM CDT that morning. 7 of the 14 touched-down in Terrebonne Parish. Fortunately, there were no fatalities although injuries (at least two) were reported.

Flooding was also a problem for several southeastern parishes, but arguably the worst flooding occurred in Avoyelles, St. Landry, and Pointe Coupee parishes, where excessive rains broke long-standing state records and overwhelming runoff led to the region's worst flooding in the modern era. Hundreds of homes and businesses were inundated, with a majority not covered by flood insurance.

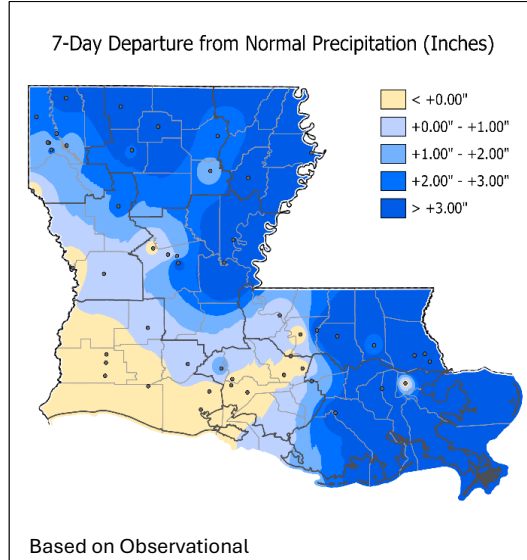
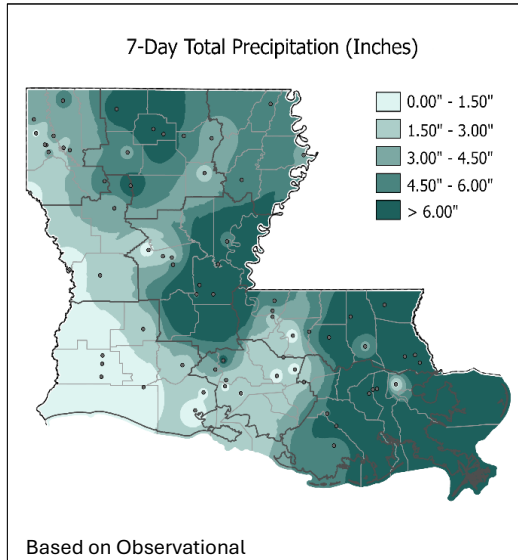
Governor Jeff Landry issued a State of Emergency declaration on June 18th, highlighting the storm impacts in six Louisiana parishes: Avoyelles, Pointe Coupee, St. Landry, Terrebonne, Lafourche, and St. Tammany. Landry also requested and received an expedited Presidential Disaster Declaration for the same six parishes on July 2nd.



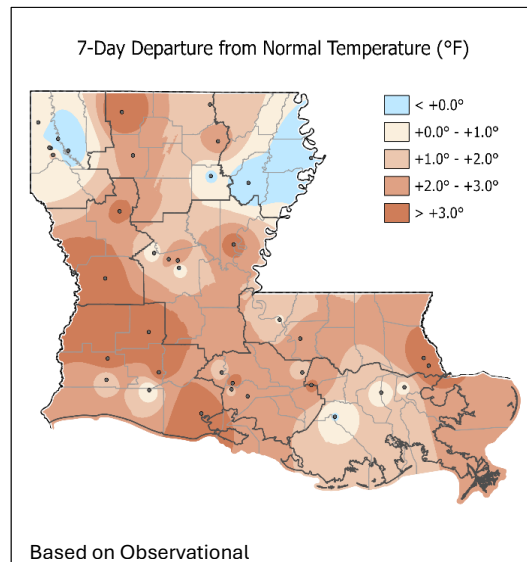
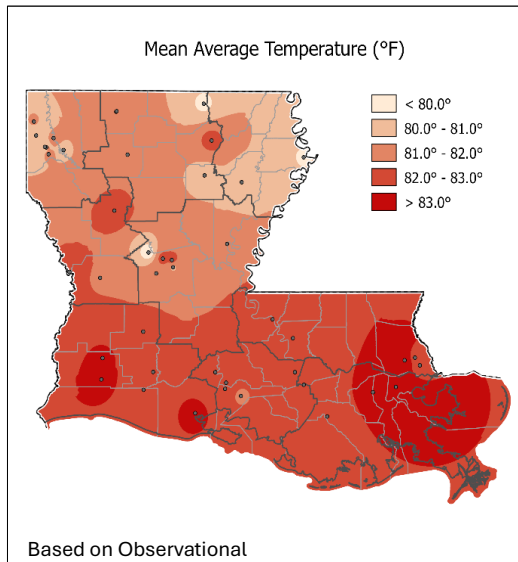
7-Day Climographs: 17 - 23 June 2026

- the remnants of Tropical Storm Arthur wreaked havoc on the Bayou State during the initial portion of the 7-day run, leading to several rounds of precipitation and flash flooding; after its departure, deep tropical moisture remained over the state which interacted with frontal boundaries and disturbances riding along the eastern edge of an upper-level ridge to produce more rounds of heavy rain
- southwestern Louisiana received rain amounts below 7-day norms as much of the moisture associated with Arthur was displaced well to the east of the center; in addition, the upper-level ridge reduced convection
- on June 18, a training band of rain and thunderstorms set up over southern Avoyelles and northern Pointe Coupee parishes for several hours; Cottonport 3.4 SE (CoCoRaHS) in Avoyelles parish recorded a total of 29.06" (p. 7), which was confirmed and will likely be validated as the new state 24-hr precipitation record; a number of 'unofficial' sites also recorded totals in excess of 20.00" for the day

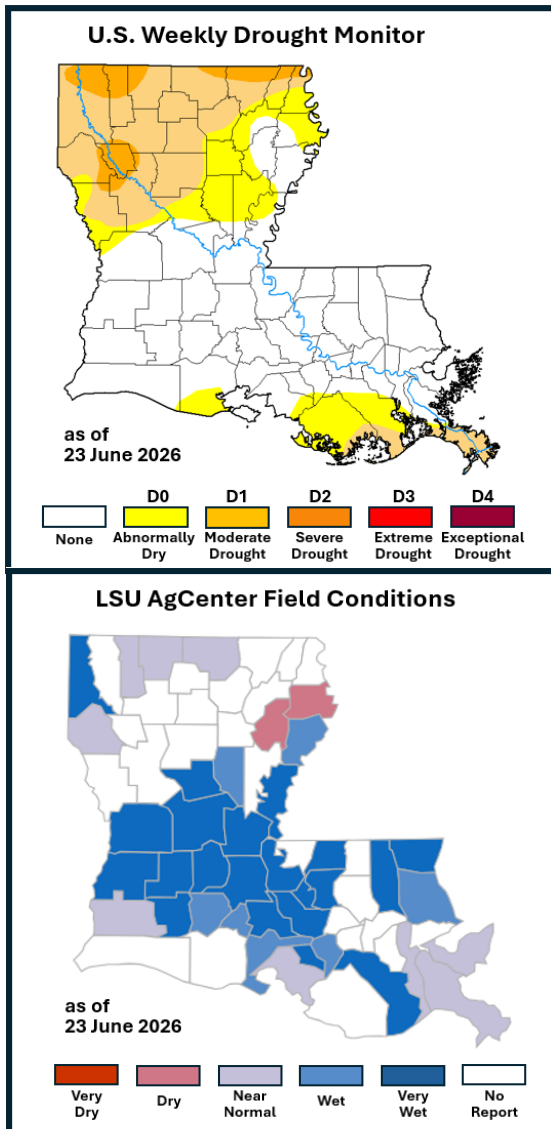


- in spite of the wet pattern, average temperatures were above 7-day norms throughout most of the state; daily maximums were reduced by rain/cloud cover; however, daily minimums averaged in the mid- to upper-70's due to high dewpoints in association with moisture from the remnants of Arthur

U.S. Drought Monitor (USDM): Issued June 25, 2026

- includes data thru June 23

- the remnants of Tropical Storm Arthur and the associated pool of tropical moisture led to several rounds of heavy rain during the 7-day monitoring period, continuing a wet pattern dating back to the beginning of May
- most reporting stations received between 3.00"-10.00" of rain during the period (p. 7-10), with as much as 30.50" at Cottonport 3.4 SE (CoCoRaHS) in Avoyelles parish (p. 8)
- saturated soils and high rain rates/amounts produced widespread flooding across the state; several river/stream gages rose above flood stage, including some that reached 'major' flood stage
- in response the updated **Drought Monitor** showed significant improvements across the Bayou State, eliminating almost all drought across southern Louisiana and eliminating 'Extreme Drought' (D3) and reducing 'Severe Drought' (D2) and 'Moderate Drought' (D1) coverage across northern Louisiana
- since the peak of the drought in mid-April, D3 coverage has declined from roughly 1/2 of the state to 0%; D2+D3 coverage has been reduced from roughly 75% of Louisiana down to just 5% this week
- as of June 21, 73% of topsoil and 67% of subsoil moisture levels are 'Adequate' or in 'Surplus' compared to 24% and 25%, respectively, during the drought's peak in mid-April
- of the reports received as of June 23, only 2 LSU AgCenter agents noted 'Dry' conditions, all others noted 'Normal', 'Wet', or 'Very Wet' conditions
- as of June 23, no parishes had Burn Bans and parish Fire Danger Levels were listed as 'Medium' or 'Low' for all monitored parishes



Louisiana Tornadoes: June 18 & 23:

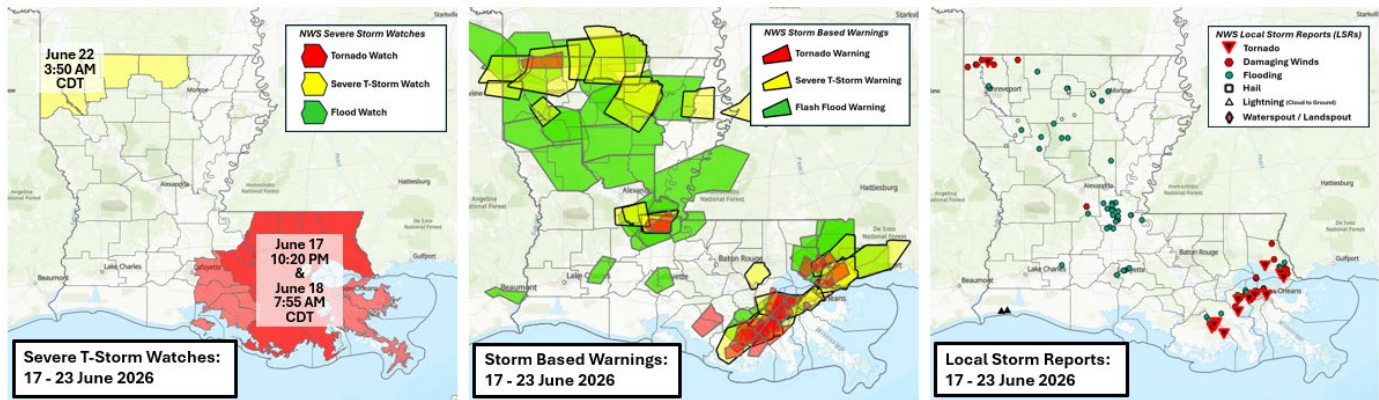
A series of touchdowns across portions of southeast Louisiana on June 18th was linked to the remnants of Arthur as they moved across the Bayou State. This was the state's second significant tornado outbreak of 2026, accounting for 14 of the 15 NWS confirmed touchdowns during the 7-day spell.

Given the clustering of tornadoes over several southeastern parishes during the event and their relative proximities to populated areas, it was fortunate that there were no fatalities and only minimal injuries.

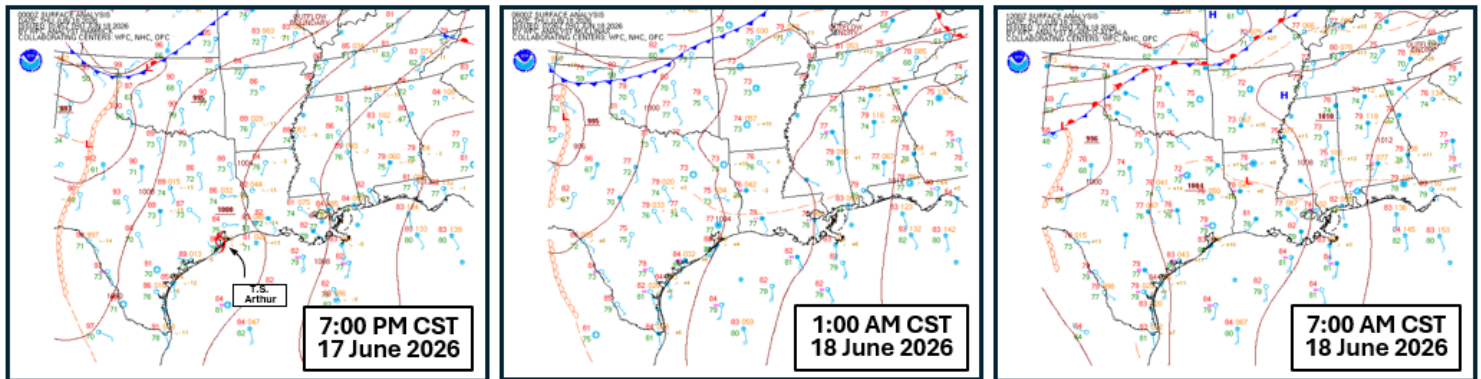
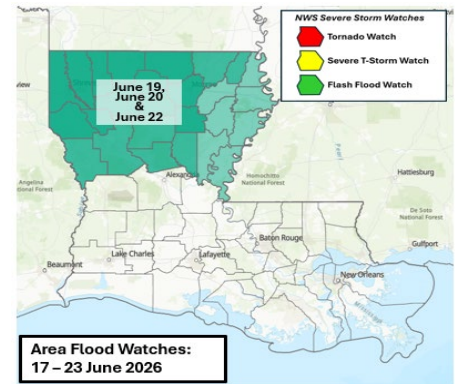


Severe/Active Weather:

A pair of *Tornado Watches* on June 17 & 18 and numerous *Storm-Based Warnings* and *Local Storm Reports* reflect the areal distribution of heavy downpours and tornadic winds around the state.

While the heavy-rain focus has been on the record-setting rains over sections of central Louisiana, note that a number of southeast Louisiana sites recorded single-day rains of 5.00" or more on June 18th as well.

In addition, three *Flood Watches* were posted for portions of northern Louisiana between June 19-22.
