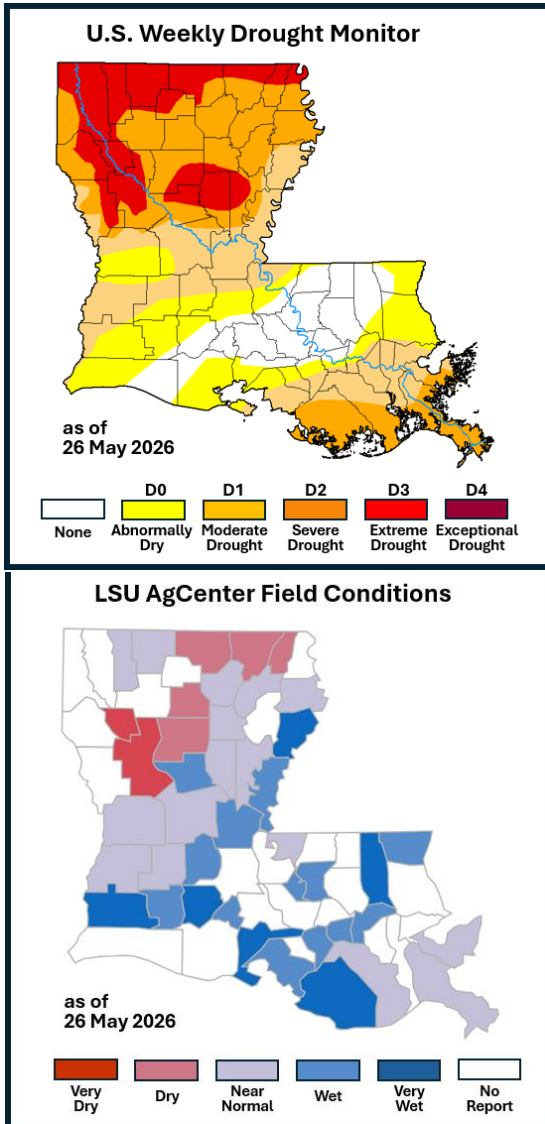
7-Day Accumulated Rainfall & Average Temperatures: 20 - 26 May 2026



- it was an active 7-day run across Louisiana as a front that eventually moved into the state on May 24 served as a focal point for waves of precipitation and severe weather (p. 4)
- the periods of at-times heavy rainfall led to numerous *Flood Watches/Warnings*, *Flash Flood Warnings*, and *Flood Advisories* across the state
- 7-day rains continued the May trend of declining drought severity across much of the Pelican State



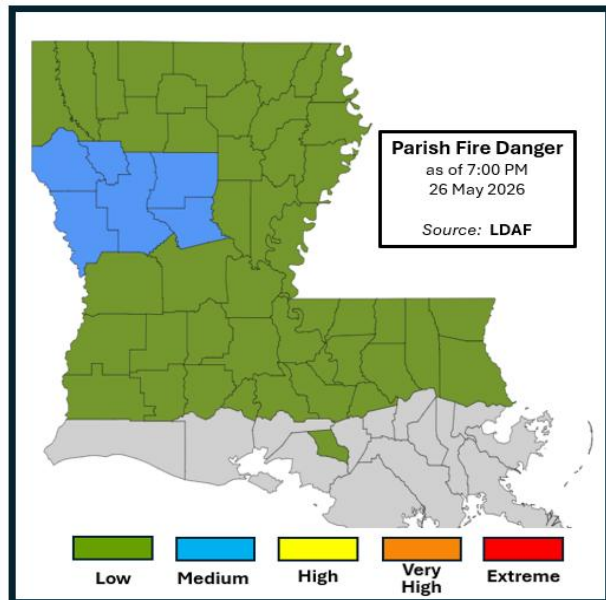
- 7-day average temperatures were slightly below-normal for most of Louisiana as daily maximum temperatures were suppressed by rounds of precipitation and associated cloud cover
- despite the overall pattern, there were still some stations that managed to exceed 90°, including 91°F at Winnsboro 5 SSE (NE Div), Natchitoches #2 (WC Div), and Donaldsonville 4 SW (SC Div) and 90°F at the Alexandria NWS COOP station (C Div) and St. Francisville 1 NE (EC Div)



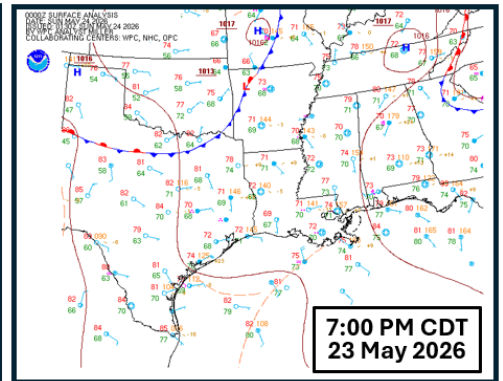
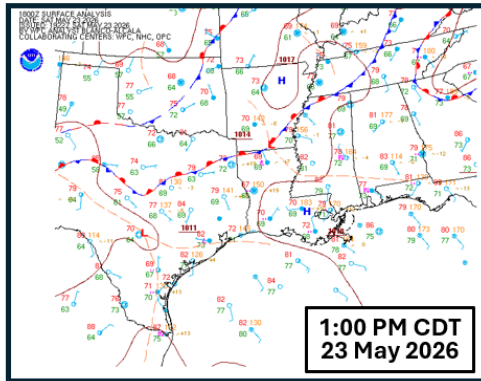
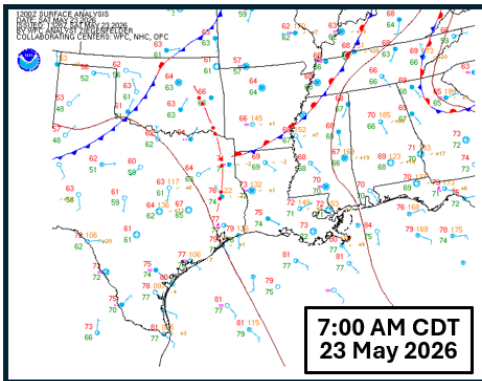
U.S. Drought Monitor (USDM): Issued May 28, 2026

- includes data thru May 26

- several rounds of precipitation inundated the state during the 7-day period, continuing to improve soil moisture and hydrologic conditions; however, localized rainfall surpluses and runoff led to urban flooding, with several rivers and bayous across the Bayou State reaching flood stage
- in response, the updated **Drought Monitor** showed improvements across the entire state, including the elimination of 'Severe Drought' (D3) across southeastern Louisiana and a significant reduction in D3 coverage across northern Louisiana; however, despite recent above-normal rainfall, there are still areas showing the impacts of longer-term moisture deficits
- nearly 2/3rds of the state is still classified as "in drought," but that is down from 3/4ths of the state for the previous 7-day period; indeed, D3 coverage to end this period was reduced by almost half of the prior 7-day coverage
- of the reports received as of May 26, LSU AgCenter agents noted "Very Dry" or "Dry" conditions across only 7 parishes (all in northern Louisiana) with "Very Wet", "Wet", or "Near Normal" conditions noted for another 36 parishes; agents also noted "Significantly Improved" or "Slightly Improved" conditions in 15 parishes
- as of May 26, no parishes had Burn Bans and parish Fire Danger Levels were listed as "Medium" or "Low" for all monitored parishes



Parish **Burn Bans** are issued and lifted by local designated agencies and/or officials. **Daily Fire Danger** maps are produced by the USDA Forest Service, the Nat'l Interagency Fire Center (NIFC) & the LDAF.



Severe/Stormy Weather:

The 7-day run proved to be “wet and weather active.”

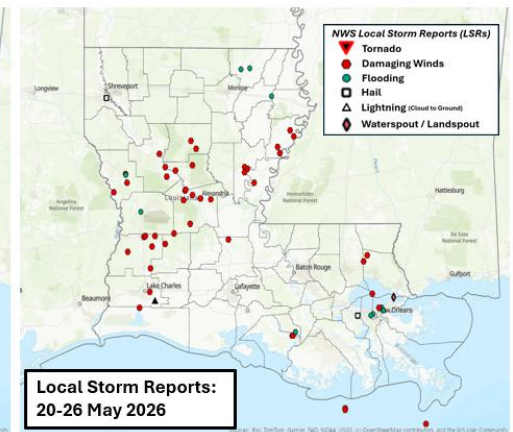
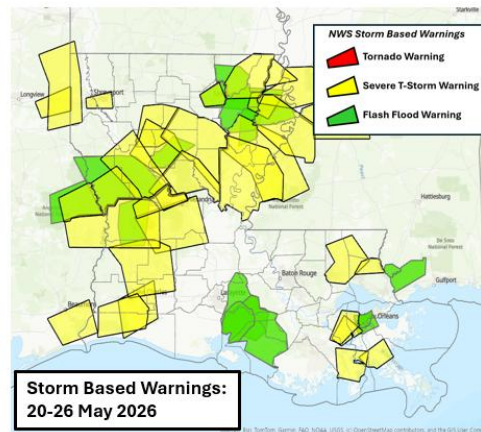
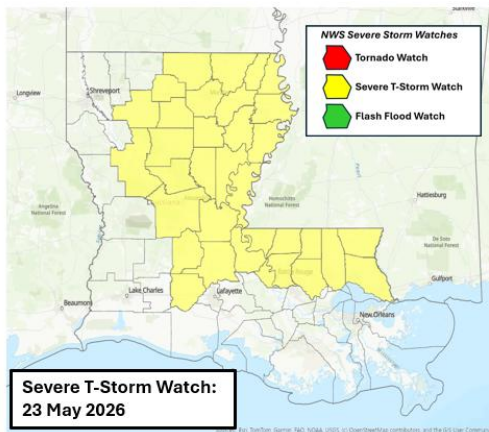
Not only was rainfall above-average statewide for the period, but a number of south Louisiana stations reported more than 5.00” over the 7 days, roughly equivalent to a month’s worth of normal rainfall. Slidell 4.4 E (EC Div) recorded the state’s largest 7-day total at 8.42”, with almost half of that falling on May 21-22.

Storms impacted some part of the state on most days during the period but May 23rd proved to be the most active day of the period. And eastward advancing squall line headed onto Louisiana from Texas certainly added to the storm impacts. That same day’s stormy pattern was reflected by the NWS Storm Prediction Center’s issuance of a *Severe T-Storm Watch* in addition to a majority of Louisiana being included in a *Flood Watch* on the 23rd.

While Louisiana was fortunate to avoid *Tornado Watches* and *Warnings* over the 7 days, public reports did note a “tropical funnel” developing on the morning of May 26th over southeastern Calcasieu Parish.

The four NWS Forecast Offices serving the Bayou State (SHV, JAN, LCH & LIX) combined to issue 15 *Flash Flood Warnings* during the period. Flood threats from locally-heavy rains prompted NWS/New Orleans (LIX) to post numerous *Flood Advisories* in and around metro New Orleans as well.

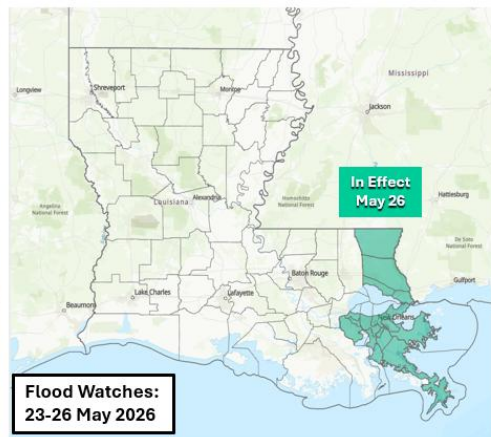
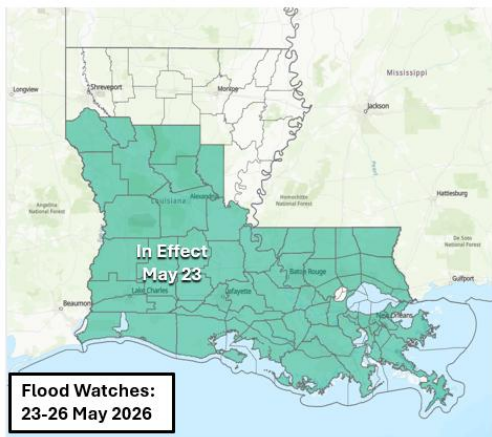
Local Storm Reports (LSRs) received from around the state are highlighted by the occurrences of damaging wind reports extending across the central parishes. As with other storm-related activity, the vast majority of these wind-related reports were received on May 23.

The 4 NWS forecast offices (SHV, JAN, LCH & LIX) also collectively issued 33 *Severe T-Storm Warnings* over the 7-day stretch, with most of those being implemented on May 23rd. Those *Severe T-Storm Warnings* were also accompanied by numerous *Marine Warnings* (not shown)

The state's primary *Flood Watch* for the 7 days was issued with the active/severe weather recorded on the 23rd. But a second *Flood Watch*, issued during the early morning of May 26 and centered over Mississippi and Alabama, did extend westward far enough to capture several extreme eastern parishes.

It's worth noting that while locally-heavy rains produced ponding and nuisance flooding for a number of areas

around the state, most rivers remained "well-behaved" in terms of flood stages.

Over the course of the current 7-day spell, only sections of the Vermilion and lower Pearl rivers exceeded their respective flood stages. And in the case of both rivers, data showed only "Minor Flooding" at its worst for their respective gaging sites.

This is in part a result of the prolonged "dry" conditions impacting much of the state. Natural, agricultural, and landscaped environments across the southern parishes were able to utilize much of the recent rainfall surpluses, even given the "wet" trend that has dominated much of Louisiana during May.
